

ORDINANCE NO. 3/15/04 (2004)

**AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING PAYMENT OF ALL DELINQUENT TAXES,
ASSESSMENTS OR OTHER CLAIMS BEFORE GRANTING
OR RENEWING LICENSES OR PERMITS**

The Town Board of the Town of Farmington does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. In addition to the requirements imposed by other provisions of state law, the following restrictions shall apply to the granting and renewal of all Licenses and Permits.

Section 2. Delinquent taxes, assessments and other claims.

A. No license or permit shall be granted for operation on any premises upon which taxes, assessments or other claims of the Town of Farmington are delinquent or unpaid, or to any person delinquent in payment of such claims to the Town of Farmington.

B. Licenses and permits will only be renewed upon receipt of full payment of delinquent taxes, assessments and other claims of the Town of Farmington.

Section 3. Procedure for Hearing.

Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Town, not to issue or renew a license or permit is entitled to a hearing before the Town Board. If the license is issued under Chapter 125, Wis. Stats., the procedure set forth in §125.12(3) and (3m) shall be followed. When §125.51 (1)(c), Wis. Stats., is applicable, the Town Board may not deny an application for nonrenewal of an existing license unless a statement of the reasons for the denial is included in the Clerk's minutes. For all other licenses or permits, the person shall be given a written notice of the reasons for the intended action and an opportunity for a hearing before the Town Board. At the hearing, the person may present evidence or call witnesses. The Town Board's decision is subject to review under Ch. 68, Wis. Stats.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect on and upon passage and publication according to law.
