

Town of Farmington – Waupaca County
General Election Type E Notice
Voting by Absentee Ballot
Election Date: Tuesday, November 3, 2026

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at their polling place on Election Day may request an absentee ballot from their municipal clerk. The elector must be registered to vote to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

Request to receive an absentee ballot:

- **The easiest way to request an absentee ballot is online through www.MyVote.wi.gov.** When using MyVote, you can complete and submit your absentee ballot request online.
- You may also request an absentee ballot by completing a Wisconsin Application for Absentee Ballot (EL-121). The completed application may be submitted to your municipal clerk by mail, by email, or in person.
 - The EL-121 application form is available from the Wisconsin Elections Commission or may be obtained from your municipal clerk.
 - Applications submitted by mail, email, or in person must be in writing and include the voter's signature.
 - **Absentee ballot requests made in person must be submitted during the designated in-person absentee voting dates for that election.** In-person requests cannot be submitted at the clerk's office outside of these dates. If you wish to submit an absentee ballot request outside of the in-person absentee voting dates, you may mail or email your completed application to the clerk or submit your request through the MyVote website.

Instead of completing the official application form or using the website, you may submit a written request for an absentee ballot. The written request must include:

1. Your full name.
2. Date of the election you are requesting an absentee ballot for.
3. Your voting address (must be within the municipality where you wish to vote).
4. The address where the absentee ballot should be mailed, if different from the address above.
5. Your signature **must** be on your request (or typed if submitting through email).
6. A copy of your photo identification.

The deadline for regular and overseas electors to request an absentee ballot for the 2026 General Election is October 29, 2026, by 5:00 p.m.

In-Person Absentee Voting:

You can also request and cast an absentee ballot in person at the clerk's office during the specified days and hours listed below.

**The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is:

**The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is:
Friday, October 30, 2026, by 1:00pm.**

No in-person absentee voting may take place on the day before the election.

The municipal clerk will deliver all voted absentee ballots received on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, at 8:00pm. Absentee ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

Voters who are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, infirmity, or disability may be exempt from the photo ID requirement. If this applies to you, please contact the municipal clerk for information regarding the deadlines and requirements for requesting and returning an absentee ballot.

Special absentee voting provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined, members of the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, please contact the municipal clerk for information regarding the deadlines and requirements for requesting and returning an absentee ballot.

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
